Commander, 184th Sustainment Command



Brigadier General Janson D. Boyles serves as Commander, 184th Sustainment Command. In this position, he oversees all of the 184th Sustainment Command's internal and external support missions in support of United States Forces, Multinational Forces and Interagency organizations worldwide. General Boyles supervises supply, maintenance and field service units and directs the synchronization of transportation, medical, personnel, finance and engineer unit activities involved with mission support. He provides technical advice and planning assistance to the Theater Sustainment Command commander on all external support activities. He plans, prepares, rapidly deploys and executes sustainment operational logistics within the assigned area

of responsibility and ensures that effective command and control is provided for continuous, anticipatory and responsive sustainment operations for all assigned and attached units.

General Boyles was commissioned in 1982 through the Reserve Officer Training Corps program at Mississippi State University. Initially commissioned as an Army Medical Department of the United States Army officer, he later re-commissioned in the United States Army Engineer Corps. In 2005, as the Deputy Commander, 168th Engineer Group, General Boyles managed the engineer response to Hurricane Katrina in Mississippi. In 2008, he deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom with the 168th Engineer Brigade as Deputy Commander overseeing Engineer Sustainment operations in Regional Command - East and Regional Command - South for the 101st and 82nd Airborne Divisions.
