MEMORANDUM FOR All Soldiers, Airmen, and Civilian Employees of the Mississippi National Guard

SUBJECT: Right to Present Complaints to or Request Assistance from the Inspector General (IG)

1. All Soldiers, Airmen, and civilian employees have the right to present complaints, grievances, or requests for assistance to the IG. These may include what the Soldier, Airman or civilian employee reasonably believes to be evidence of fraud, waste and/or mismanagement.
2. Before visiting the IG, military members should consider whether their concerns could be addressed more quickly and simply by referring them to their chain of command. You do not have to present your concerns to your chain of command before visiting the IG; however, you must obtain permission to be absent from your duties if you wish to visit the IG during your duty hours. You are not required to tell anyone why you want to speak with an IG.
3. Before visiting the IG, civilian employees should consider whether their concerns can be addressed more quickly and simply by referring them to their immediate supervisor first, or by using one of the following procedures:
 - a. Personnel regulations prescribe procedures for civilian employees to use in submitting complaints that pertain solely to civilian employment matters. These include complaints on personnel actions such as reductions-in-force, removals, disciplinary measures and similar actions. Federal Civilian Technicians may contact COL John P. Hardy in the Human Resources Office at (601) 313-6343. State Employee personnel may contact Mr. Frank Janotta at (601) 313-6213. These personnel officers will provide information concerning pertinent regulations and procedural requirements.
 - b. To submit a complaint about discrimination in employment because of race, color, religion, sex, age, national origin, sexual orientation, or handicap condition you may contact the Equal Opportunity Office at (601) 313-6124. Federal Civilian Technician, State Employee personnel and Equal Opportunity offices are located in the Mississippi National Guard, Joint Force Headquarters Building at 1410 Riverside Drive, Jackson, MS 39202.

5. If you believe your local IG's response to you is not fair, incomplete, or not in accordance with law and regulation; or if you believe your interests may be jeopardized by contacting your local IG, you may write to National Guard Bureau: Office of the Inspector General at HQ, NGB-IG/Suite 1D163, 1636 Defense Pentagon, Washington, DC 20301-1636. 6. You may report complaints about hazardous work conditions (unsafe or unhealthy) by using procedures in AR 385-10.

7. In accordance with AR 20-1, paragraph 1-12, the IG has a duty to protect confidentiality to the maximum extent possible. This is true for all persons who seek assistance from the IG, make a complaint, give evidence, contact or assist an IG during an inspection or investigation, or otherwise interact with an IG.

8. Department of the Army and Air Force personnel are prohibited from taking any action that restricts you from filing a complaint, seeking assistance, or cooperating with the IG, or a member of Congress. They are also prohibited from taking any disciplinary or adverse action against you for filing a complaint, seeking assistance, or cooperating with the IG, a member of Congress, or any agency established to receive such complaints. However, if you knowingly make false accusations to the IG, you are subject to disciplinary action.
